




Extensive Reading Programme (Library Periods)

• Expect an **interesting variety of very good books**



P3/4 Assessments

Assurance of Quality: Exam Papers and Marking Processes

- Setters and vetters of exam papers are teachers at that level
- The exam papers are further vetted by EL Teacher Leaders (HOD/Subject Head/Senior Teachers) and Principal
- For oral and Paper 1 components, teachers undergo a rigorous standardisation exercise at the start of the school year, and prior to the End-of-Year exams to ensure that marking standards are adhered to
- **NOTE: the school will NOT entertain any requests for a review of oral and Paper 1 marks**
- Teachers may provide 1-to-1 review of the exam component with the student to help the child understand his mistakes and know how to move forward



OTHER ASSESSMENT MODES

Assessment Mode/Tasks	Details of Assessment Mode/Task
tests and quizzes	timed/non-timed, independent assignments at the end of a few units of work, including spelling
performance assessments	assessing students' skills in carrying out an activity, e.g., giving an oral presentation
student profiling	through the use of checklists and classroom observations by teachers or through self-evaluation by students, e.g., self-evaluation records or checklists.
observations	Targeted/planning/spontaneous observations, which informs teachers of the learning needs of students
teacher-student conferencing	on a written product/representation in order to help students make improvements by using a set of criteria and giving specific comments.

Comprehension Strategies

Reinforce strategies taught in school:

- a) Read the passage at least twice.
- b) Get your son to ask probing questions himself using the Techniques of 'Why, Who, When, Where, Which, How'.
- c) Highlight words that they are unfamiliar. Discuss its meaning and how it is used in a sentence / scenario.

Comprehension Strategies

Reinforce strategies taught in school:

d) When answering the questions, ensure that your child does so in a complete sentence. Check for spelling, grammar, punctuation, sentence structure. These skills are taught in class but they need to be reinforced.

Are there books you recommend the boys to read in their leisure time?

Yes, leisure reading is strongly encouraged as it plays a vital role in developing vocabulary, imagination, and writing fluency.

- Classic and contemporary fiction from authors like *Roald Dahl*, *Michael Morpurgo* or *Katherine Rundell*.
- Adventure and mystery stories that excite the boys
- Biographies and autobiographies
- Chicken Soup for the Soul series of books
- Myon has a very wide selection for the boys to explore and teachers do assign them readings based on the Stellar texts that they have covered in class.
- National Library Board also has a suggested reading list according to their age group.

Most importantly, encourage boys to read texts they enjoy, as enjoyment is key to cultivating lifelong reading habits. Teachers also guide students towards books that gradually stretch their language and thinking.
